La Cienega Park Infield Renovation

Park Operations Staff renovated field #1 (south field) for the upcoming Beverly Hills Little League season. The existing 8,500 square feet of turf grass was removed, the soil was amended, the playing area was laser leveled, the irrigation was adjusted/fine-tuned, and the entire infield playing surface was re-sodded with a ball park blend turf grass. The new turf grass is a warm-season Hybrid Bermuda and over-seeded with a blend of cool season Ryegrass and Kentucky Bluegrass. On your next visit to La Cienega Park, please enjoy the athletic fields as the baseball season is quickly approaching.

Drought – Fix-A-Leak Week

On February 8, 2022 the Beverly Hills City Council declared a Drought in Beverley Hills. In order to use water efficiently, the City would like to remind you to only water your landscaped areas two (2) days per week this time of year. In addition, in honor of Fix-A-Leak week (March 15-21), please check for leaks around your property.

Running or leaking toilets are the #1 cause of water leaks in homes. Did you know that one leaky toilet can waste up to 200 gallons of water an hour!

City to Install Minimum Grid Bicycle Pavement Markings

“Sharrow” network is a first step to implement the Complete Streets Plan

On January 4, 2022, the City Council approved installation of a Minimum Grid Bikeway Network. The term “minimum grid” refers to the concept of quickly implementing a basic bikeway network, while also continuing to pursue longer-range efforts to expand and upgrade cycling infrastructure.

The City’s Minimum Grid Network will consist of Class III bicycle routes, which are shared streets between motorists and bicyclists that highlight bicycle travel via sharrow pavement markings and signage. Bike routes are not bike lanes and do not require removal of any vehicle lanes or parking. Shared roadway pavement markings (sharrows) and

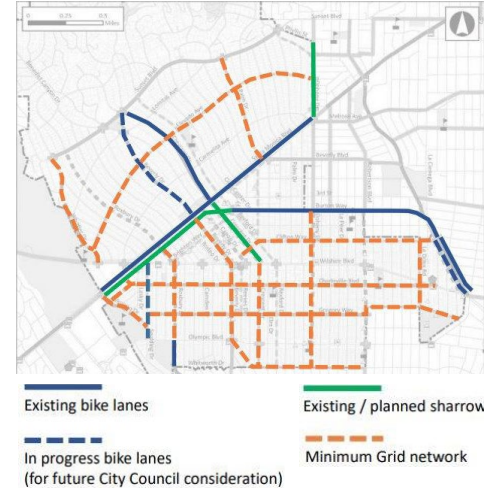
signage help bicyclists navigate the bikeway network, avoid streets that can be more challenging to ride on, and determine proper lane positioning outside of the “door zone.”

The Minimum Grid Network includes streets that provide access to schools, parks, existing bikeways, future Metro stations, and key commercial corridors. All streets on the Minimum Grid Network are included on the Holistic Bikeways Network Map from the Complete Streets Plan.

Staff anticipates installation of the Minimum Grid Network will be completed by April 2022.
